

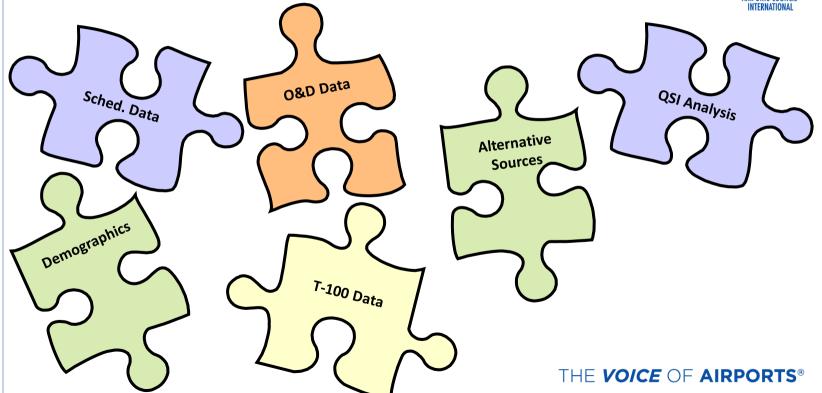

GUIDELINES FOR USING AIR SERVICE DATA



- Use data that matters and enhances the business case
- If you meet with an airline several times, change it up!
- Don't regurgitate data back to the airlines they already have
- Ask yourself: What does the airline want to see? What does the airline
 NOT want to see?
 - What would pique your interest if you were sitting on the other side of the table?
- It's all about relationships and the data/business case could help or possibly hurt

ROLE OF THE AIRPORT IN AIR SERVICE DEVELOPMENT



- Provide internal data reports and air service updates to airport team
 - Monitor schedule data for weekly changes
- Maintain relationships with airline network planning and sales
- Team with economic development and tourism stakeholders to maintain and pursue air service
 - Stay up to date on regional economic development and tourism trends
- Attend air service speed-dating conferences and air service development meetings at airline headquarters but also communicate with airlines via e-mail/conference call
- Stay up to date attend conferences, listen to earnings calls, read periodicals, read analyst research, etc.

ROLE OF THE CONSULTANT IN AIR SERVICE DEVELOPMENT



- Partner with the airport in its air service development program:

 - Incentive Program Design & Benchmarking
 - Strategic Marketing Plans
