

## U.S. AIRPORT INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS 2017 - 2021

U.S. airports have nearly \$100 billion in infrastructure needs during 2017 - 2021 to accommodate growth in passenger and cargo activity, rehabilitate existing facilities, and support aircraft innovation, according to ACI-NA's latest Infrastructure Needs Study released in March 2017.



### KEEP AMERICA'S AIRPORTS FROM FALLING BEHIND

Our nation's airports are falling behind. U.S. airports need new infrastructure investments to modernize for 21st century air travel demands. With \$20 billion in annual infrastructure needs, current funding only scratches the surface of airport funding requirements. It's time to get wWashington out of the way of local airport investment decisions and help Wyoming airports become more financially self-sufficient.

We can meet our airport infrastructure needs by:

- Eliminating federal restrictions on the local Passenger Facility Charge user fee.


