



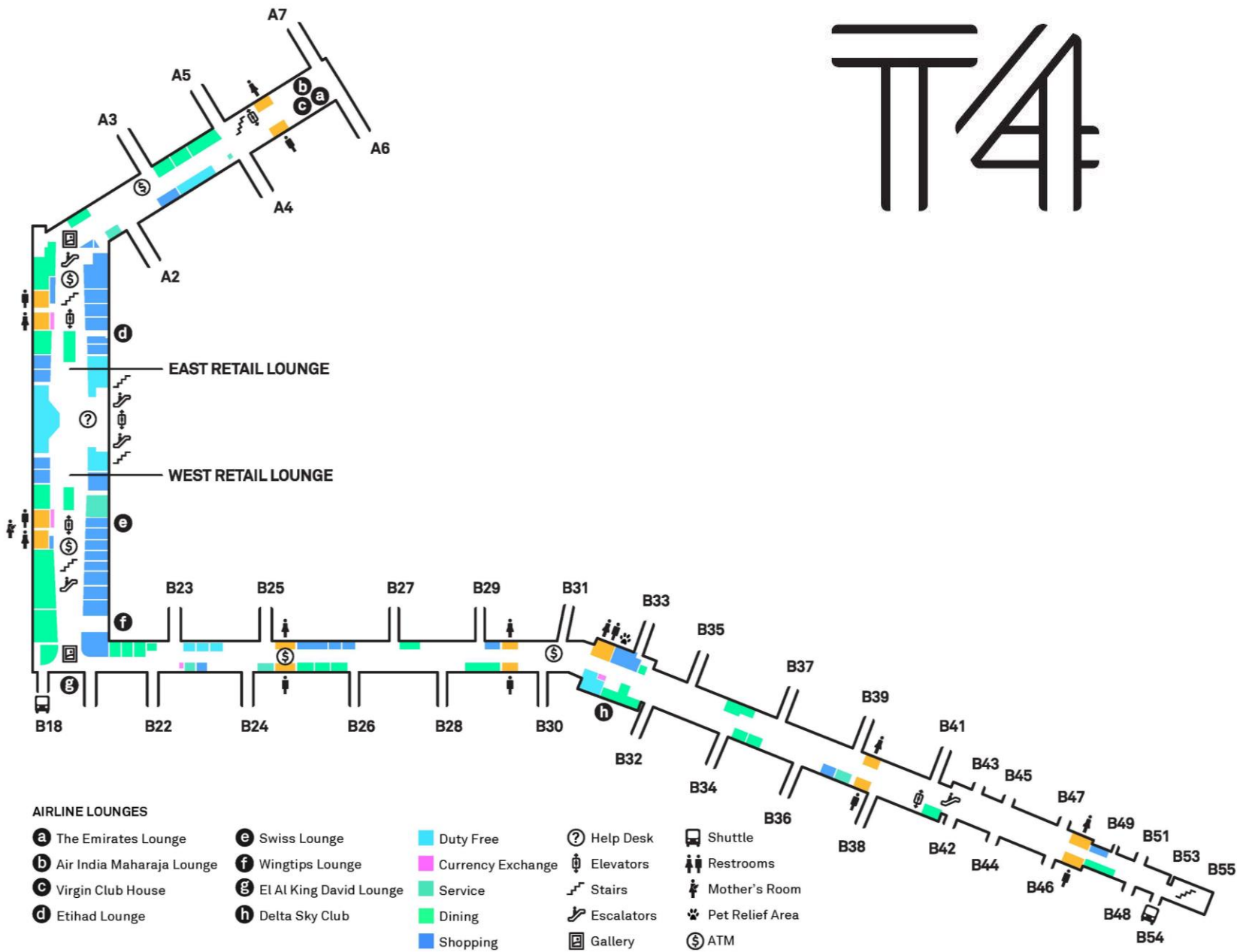

T4 has become the first airport terminal in the United States to achieve LEED Gold Certification in Existing Building Operations and Maintenance. Through energy efficiency, sustainable purchasing, and habitat protection, JFKIAT has shown a thorough commitment to protecting and restoring the environment in the region and across the globe.


