SFO HR Role

- We care about the People
- We support Operations as part of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) – Logistics section as HR Unit Leader
- SFO Disaster Service Worker Standard Operating Guidelines (March 2018)
- EOC has own system and processes, including communications.

- During the crisis:
 - Report on employees' residence geographically
 - Contact employees by phone, texts, emails
 - Track their status daily
 - Offer information and assistance until crisis is over



Crisis Planning, Response, and Recovery

- Previous role as Deputy City Administrator
 - served under City Administrator Ed Lee
 - Hurricane Katrina
 - Importance of Leadership & Governance
 - Lifelines Council, Disaster Council
- Every incident was an opportunity to plan and to improve
 - Fire in City Hall basement
 - Planned and Unplanned evacuations of Civic Center
 - PRIDE Parade; Bay to Breakers Race; World Series 2012



Crisis Planning, Response, and Recovery

- Planning SFO Disaster Service Worker Standard Operating Guidelines; EOC activations;
 Phone Trees; Resources
- **Training** ICS 100, 200, 300, 400; TEEX Enhanced Emergency Operations Center Training (ICS-319); WebEOC
- **Exercises** Full Scale Active Shooter 2016; SFO with Airlines on Friends & Family Reunification
- **Response** Rim Fire (Procurement); Crisis Counselors for Fire, Police & first responders like Airfield Operations, Communication Center dispatchers, and mutual aid
- **Recovery** Financial costs; Importance of Recognition in public settings



Governance

- Airport is one of 40+ departments in the City. We have an Airport Commission. Depending on the crisis, it could affect Airport only.
- If it is citywide, Department of Emergency Management reports to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors. Emergency Declarations: San Francisco Mayor; Governor of California; Presidential through FEMA
- Affects People, Processes, Systems and Technology
 - Everbridge Emergency Notification Systems and Peoplesoft People & Pay System
 - Controller's Office Semiannual SF Prepared Department Operations Center (DOC)
 Finance and Administration Section Training, including emergency procurement
- Leadership and Continuity of Government Mayor Ed Lee's Passing City Charter, Board of Supervisors' Actions, and Elections
