Core-Based Statistical Area

A CBSA is one or more counties with an urbanized cluster of at least 10,000 people. The area as a whole is defined by the interaction between the core and the outlying areas. This interaction, measured by commuting, means that at least 25 percent of people in outlying areas are working in the core. The CBSA is a generic definition of MICROS and MSAs, the difference being core population size.

Micropolitan Statistical Areas

A MICRO is simply a small CBSA, i.e., a county or counties with an urbanized core of 10,000 but fewer than 50,000 in population. Outlying areas included are, again, defined by commuting patterns.

Metropolitan Statistical Areas

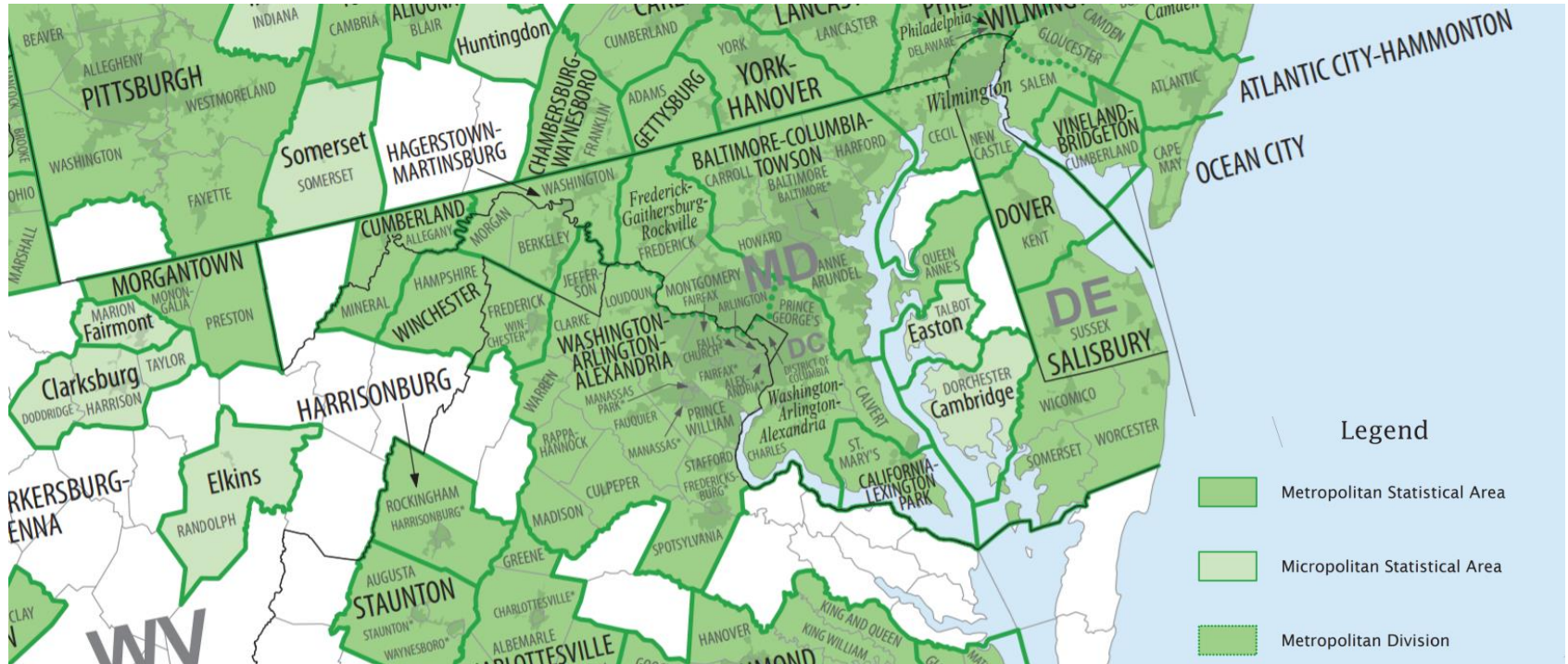
An MSA has an urbanized core of minimally 50,000 population and includes outlying areas determined by commuting measures

Combined Statistical Areas

CSAs are two or more adjacent CBSAs in which there is at least a 15 employment interchange (measured by commuting) between cores. If this exchange is 25 percent or higher between a pair of CBSAs, they are combined into a CSA automatically; if the measure is at least 15 percent but below 25, local opinion in both areas is used to decide on combination.

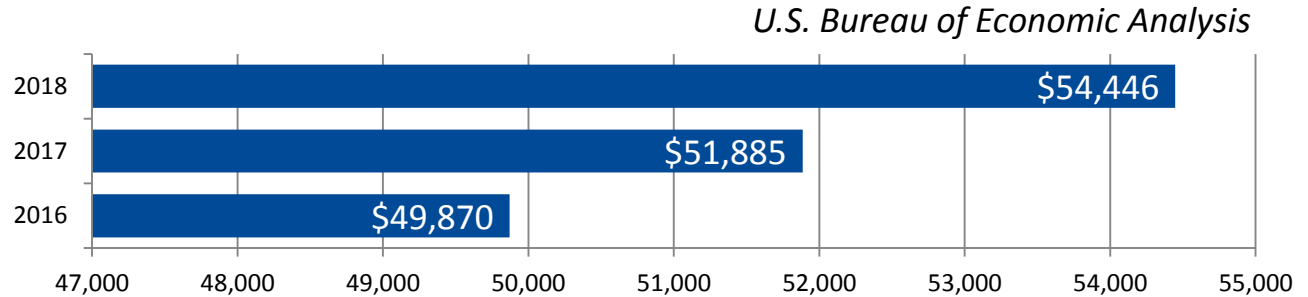

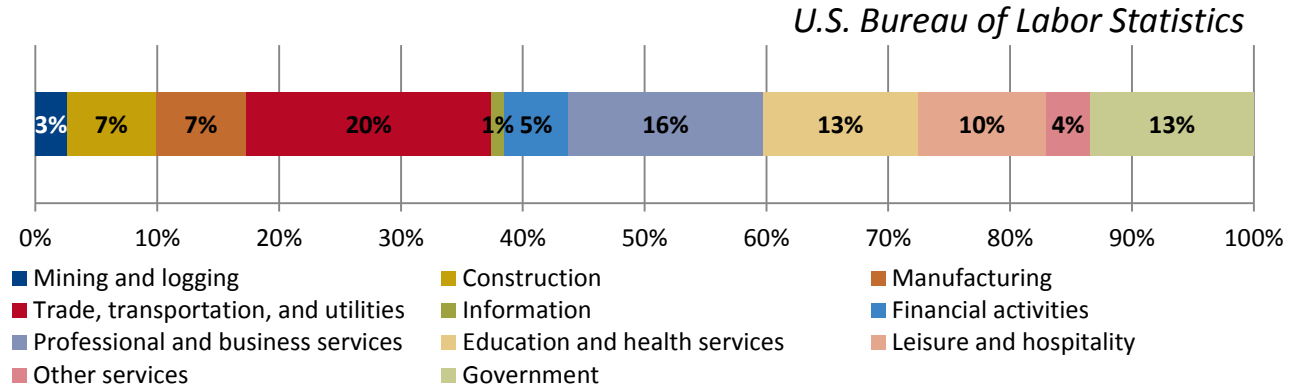

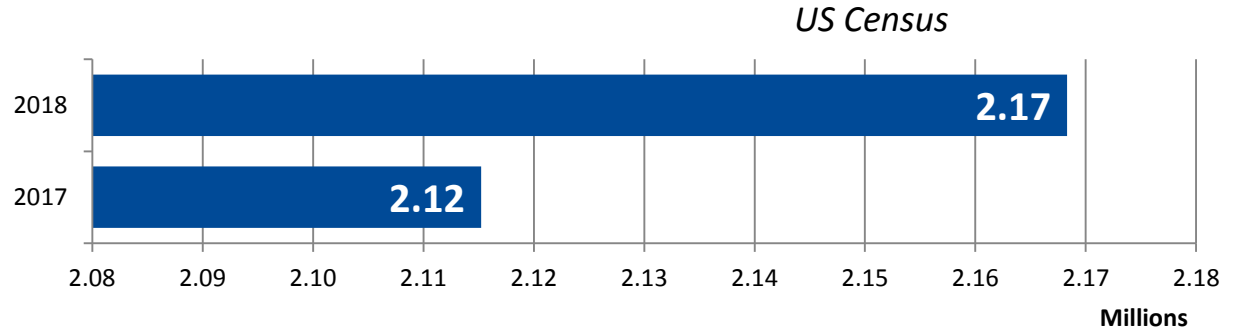
Employment by sector



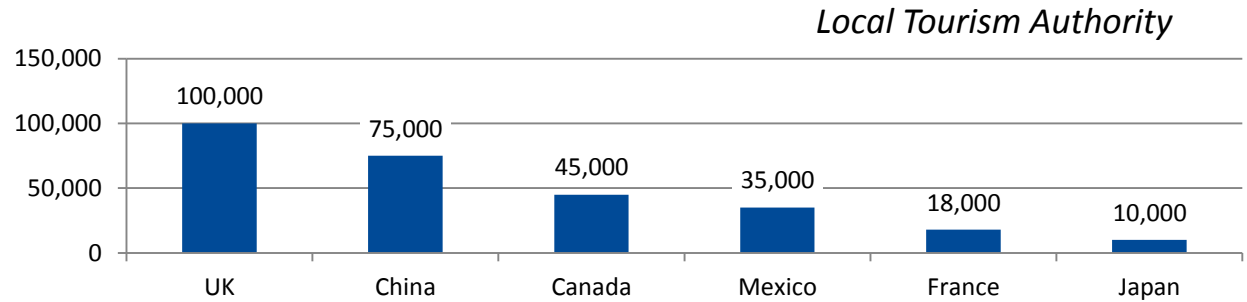

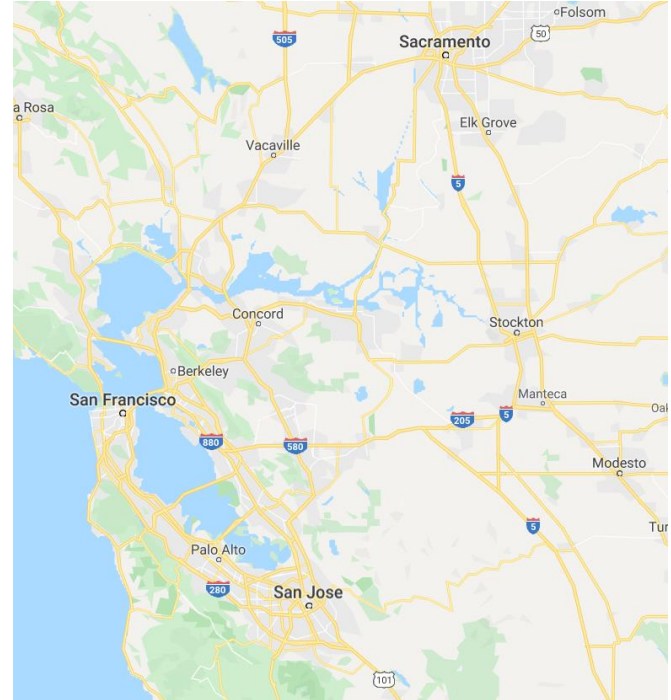

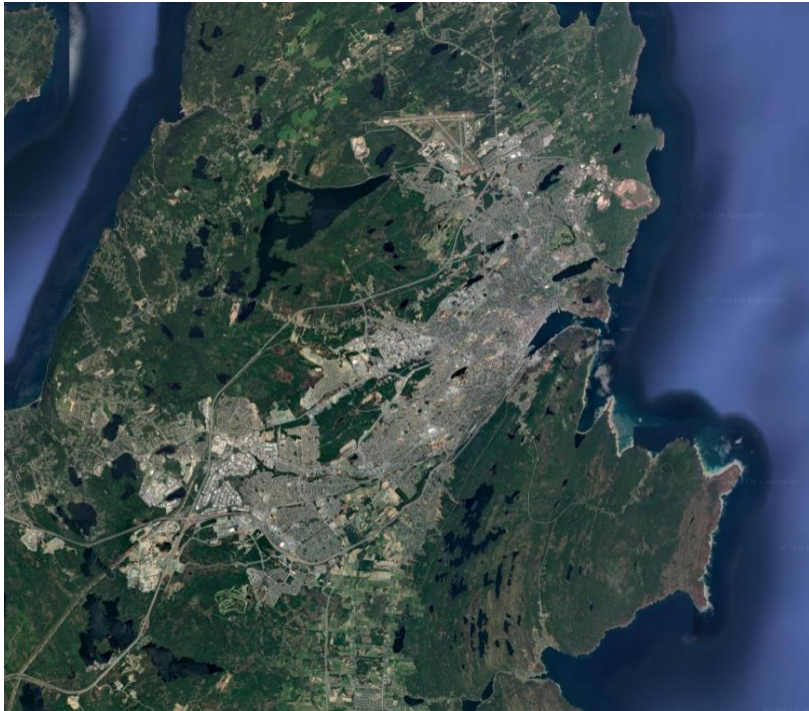

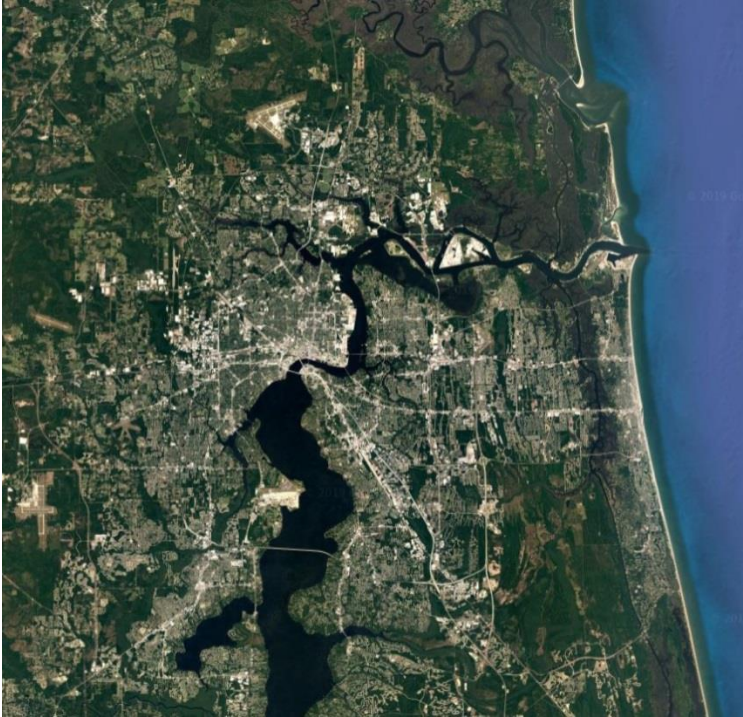
